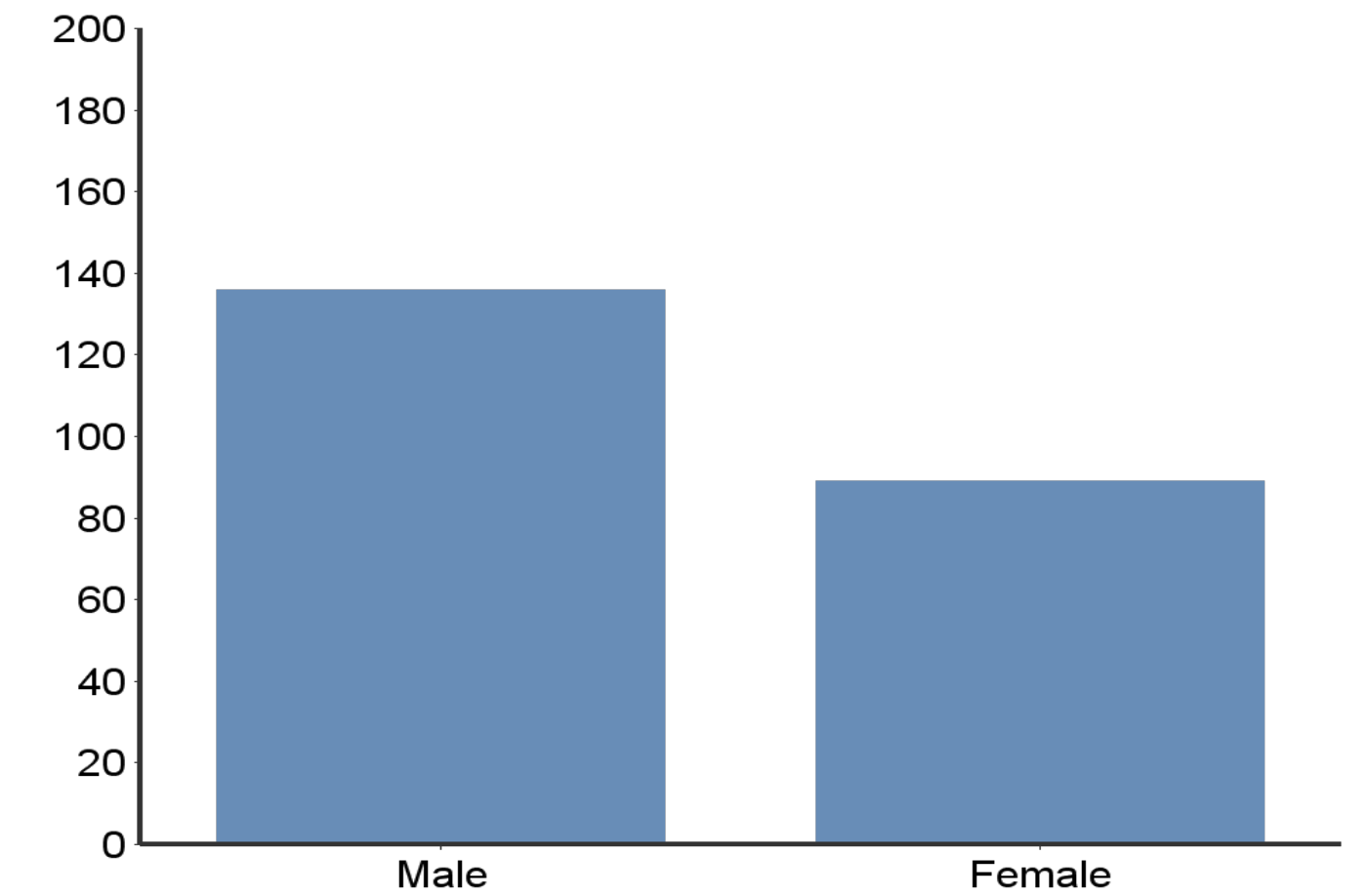
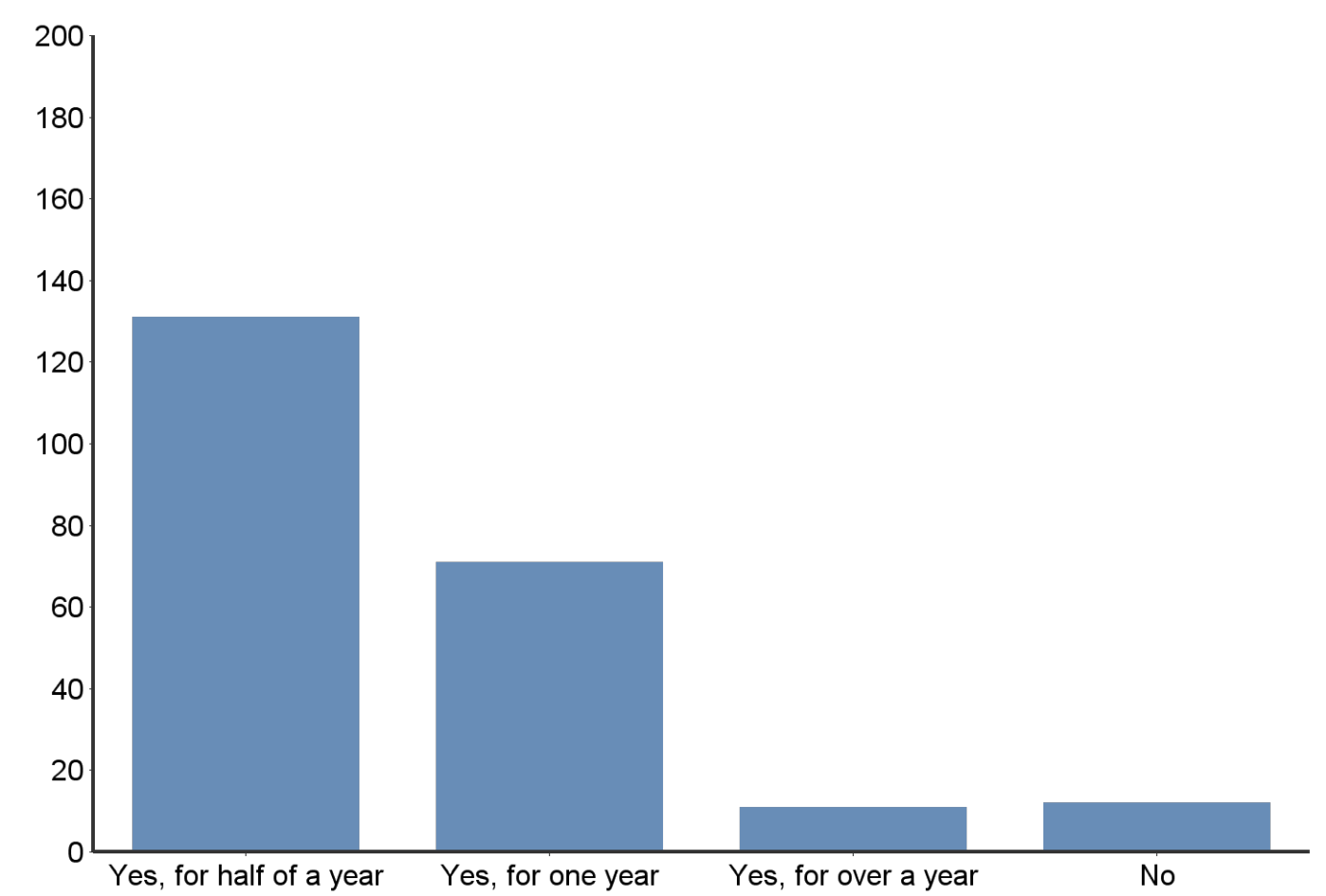

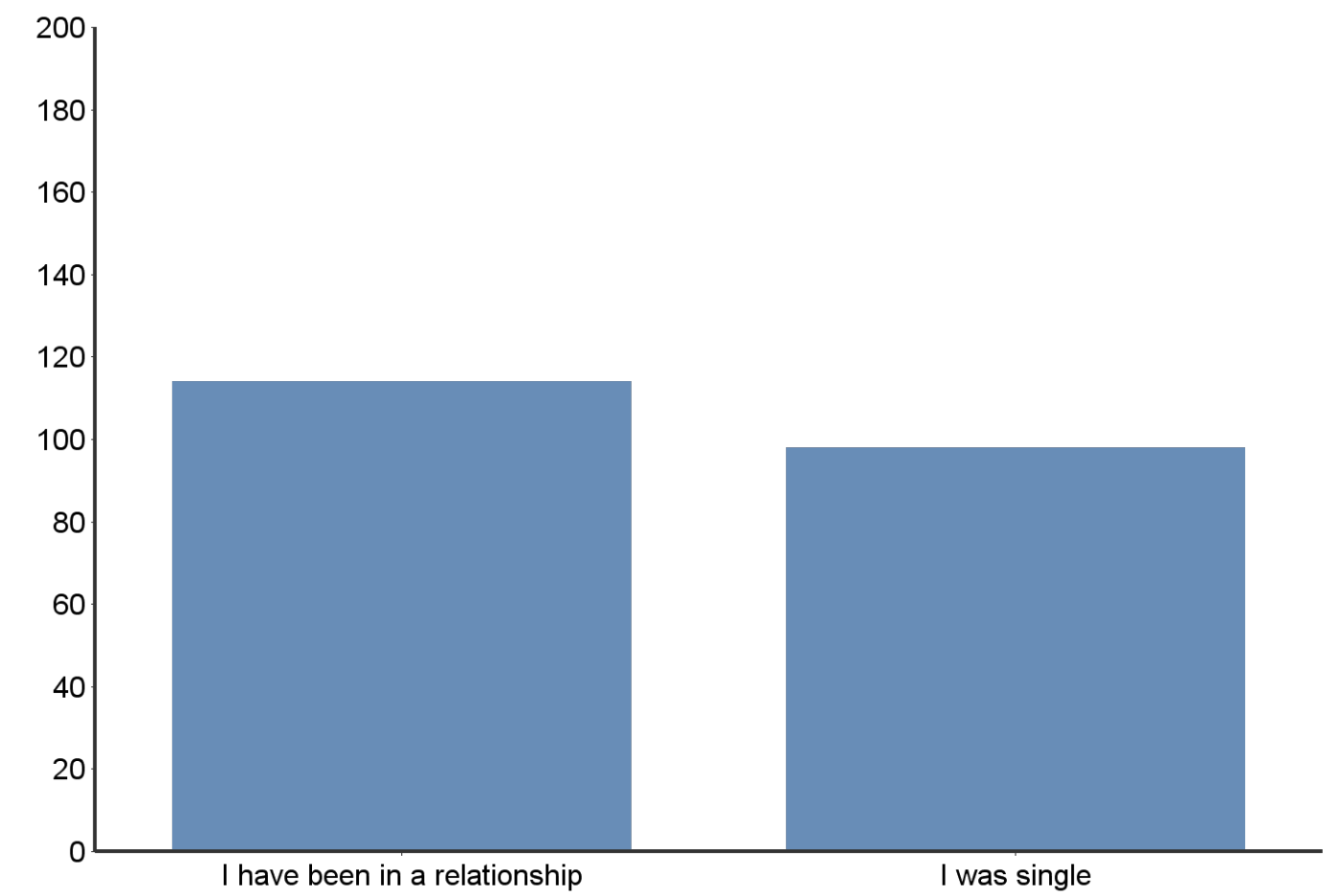

Have you ever been abroad for a long time?



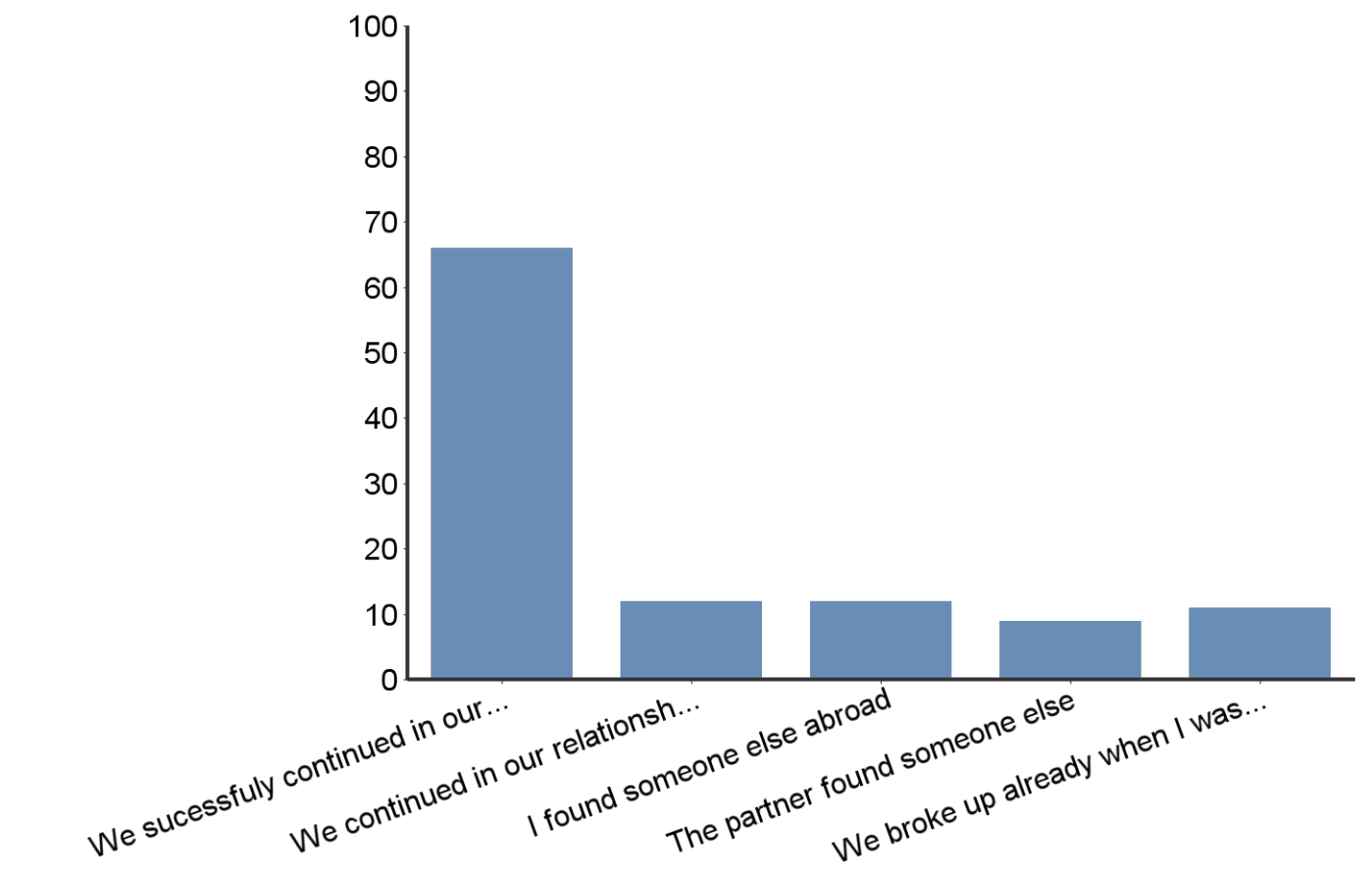

When did you go abroad:



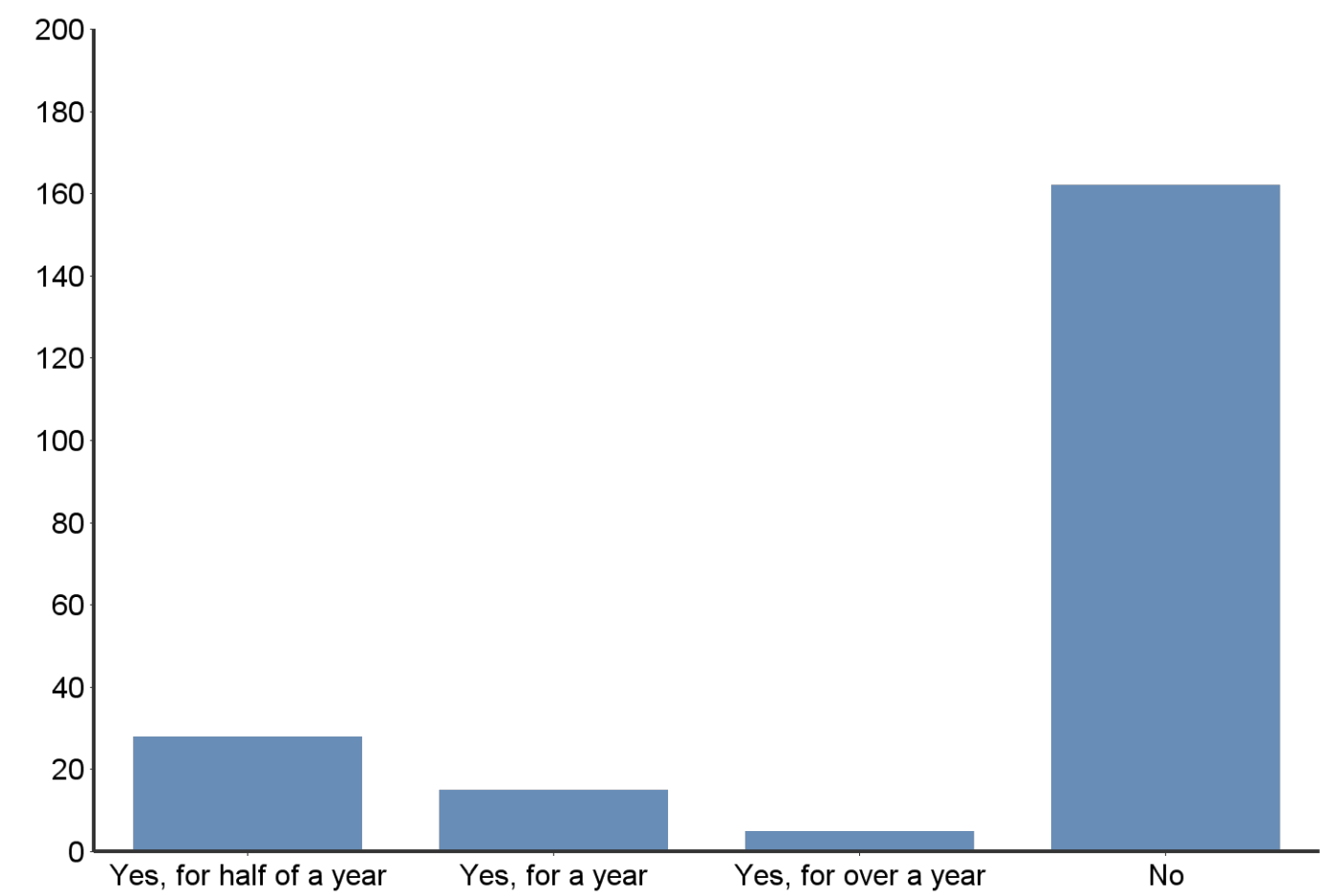

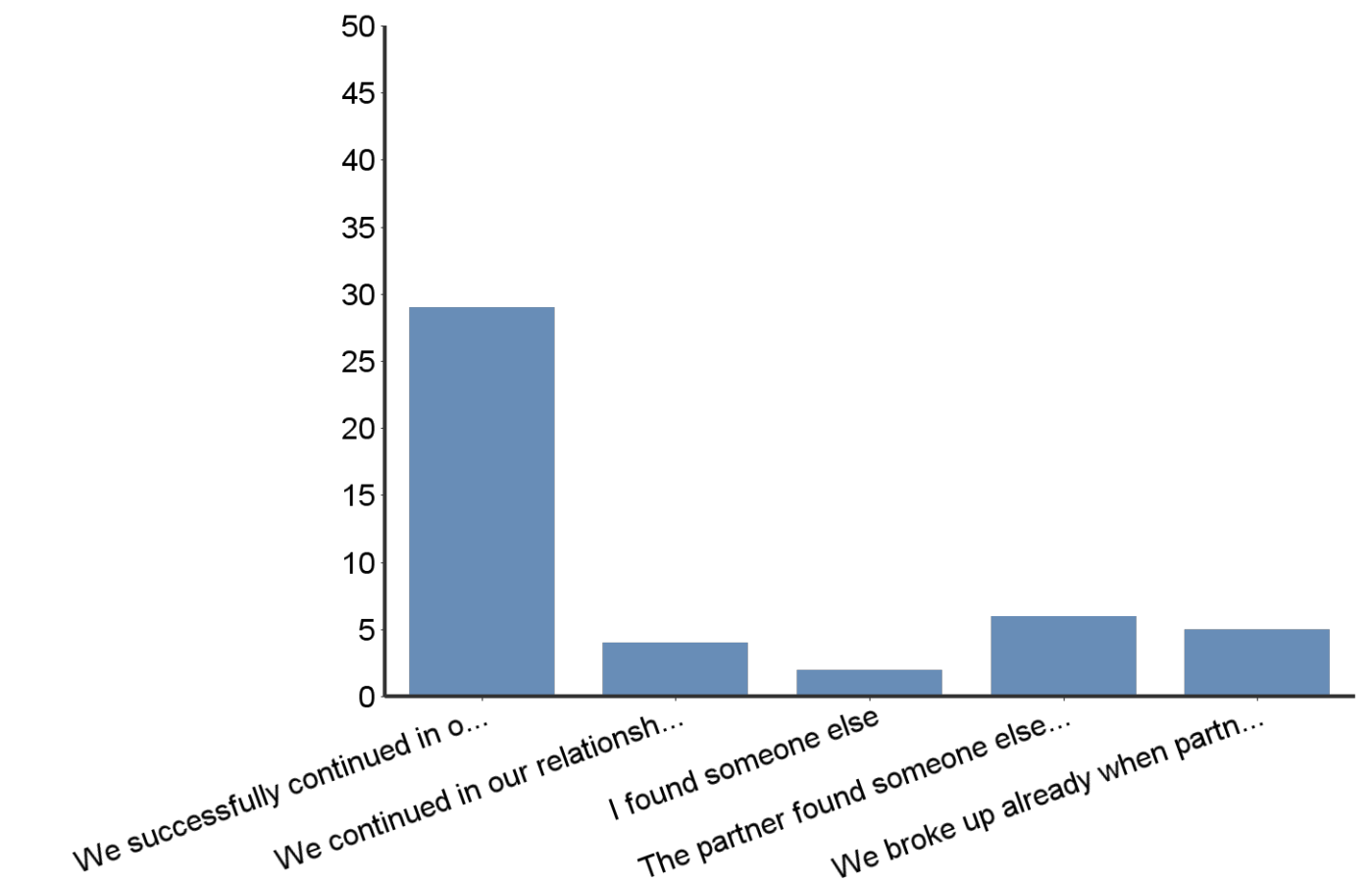

Did your partner go abroad for a long time (without you)?



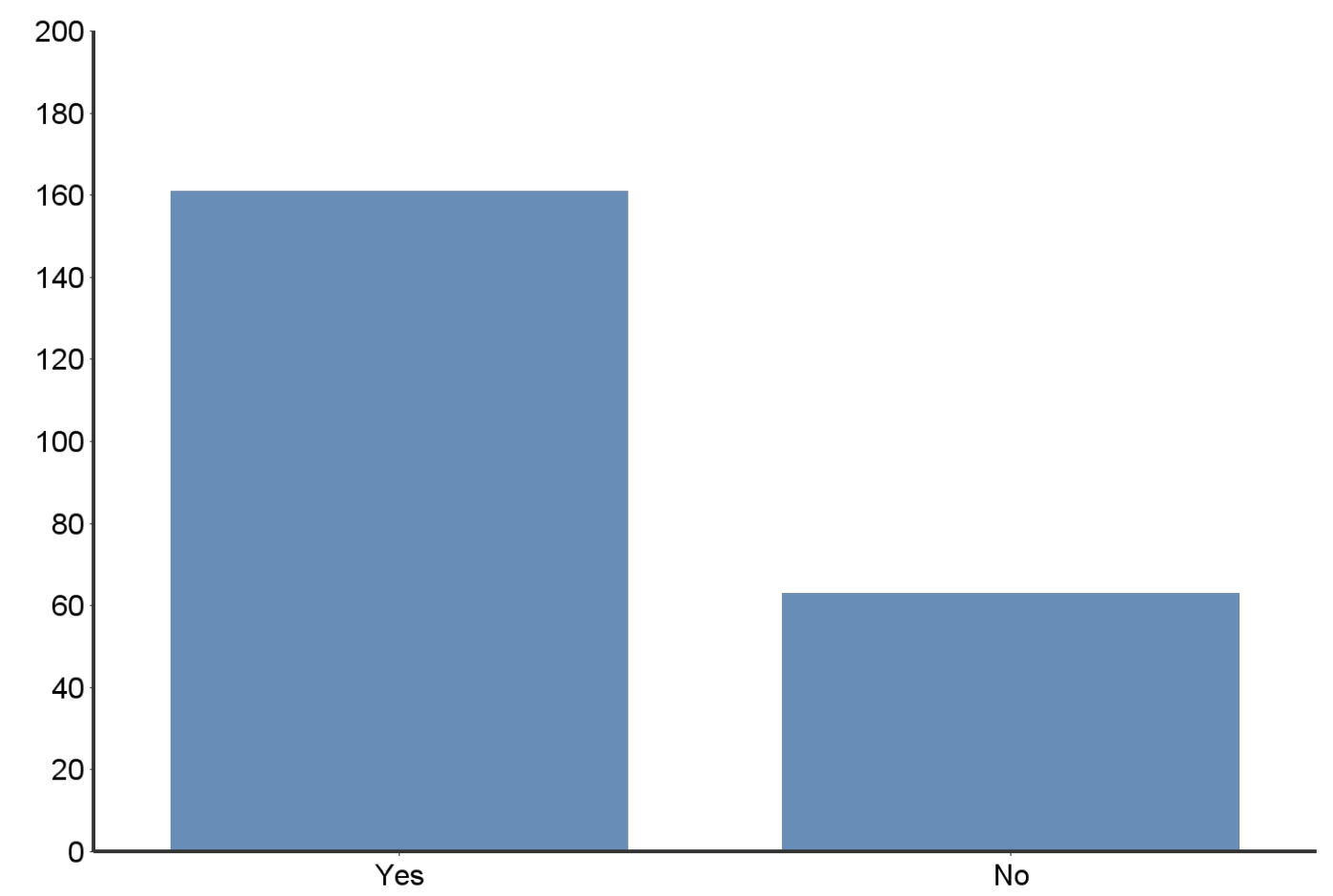

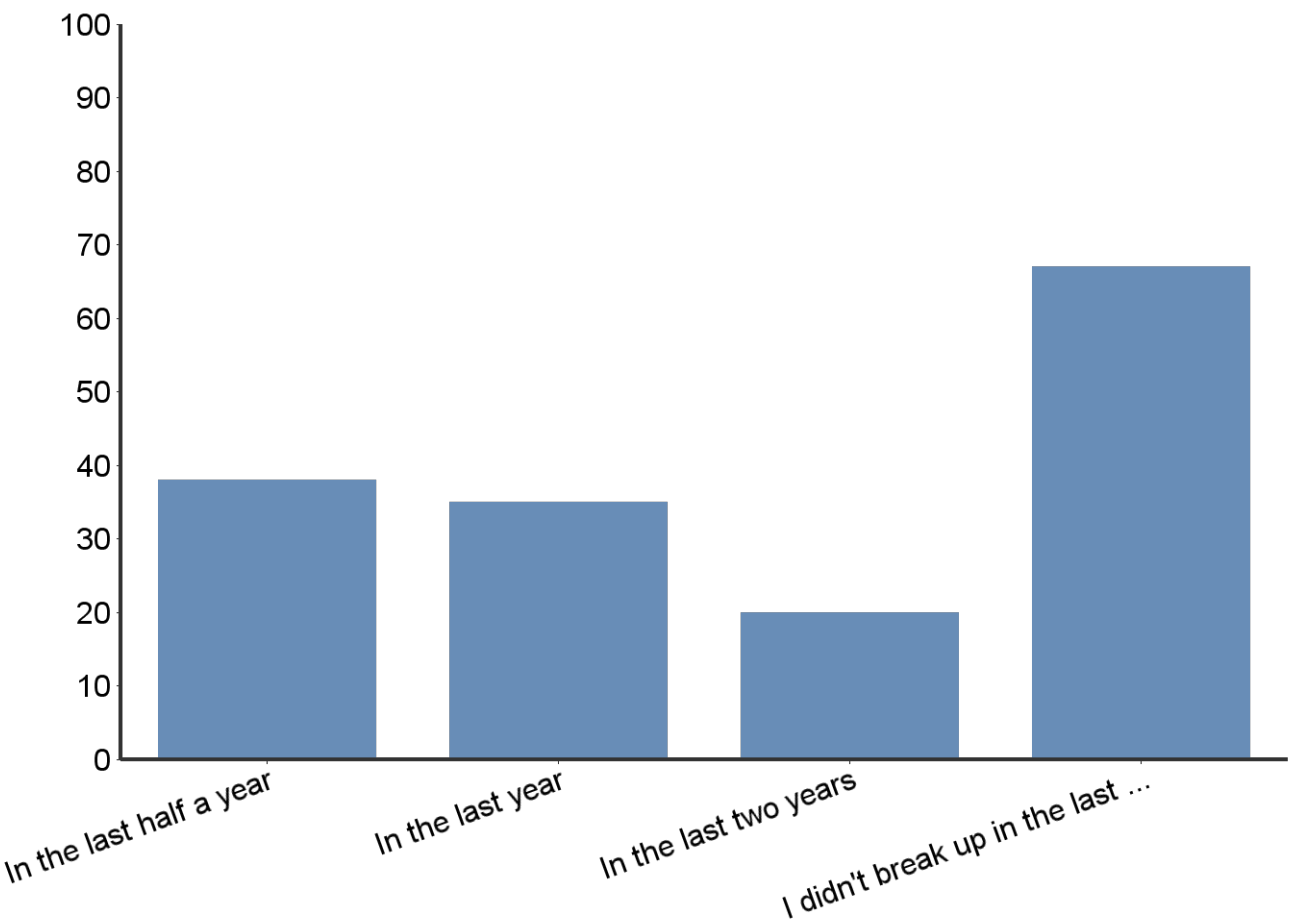
